**Under this agreement for 2017
Coomabah State School will receive**

\$295,007*

This funding will be used to

- Increase the % of students achieving at or above NMS in year 3 reading to 95% and in year 5 reading to 95%
- Increase the % of students in the U2B in reading in year 3 to 40% and in year 5 to 35%
- Increase the % of students achieving at or above NMS in year 3 numeracy to 95% and in year 5 numeracy to 95%
- Improve the capacity and capability of teachers to effectively teach reading through coaching and use of consistent school practices.
- Provide for small group instruction based on data informed target areas in numeracy in year 3 and 5 (Semester 1) and year 2,4 and 6 (Semester 2)
- Target disengagement of students and parents.

Our initiatives include

- Employing coaches to focus on reading with teachers to build a consistent school approach to instruction.
- Employing and training of Teacher aides to assist in provision of guided reading instruction
- Training teachers in data analysis based on specific targeted concepts that individual students need help with and then focusing on these concepts in a structured small group setting.
- Providing teachers with skills to build engagement with learning for our students and engagement with parents to become informed partners in learning with their teacher and their child.
- Providing teachers with the opportunity to be peer coaches using the Growth Coaching model to discuss and build their teaching capacity in school priority areas.
- Teacher development of skills in giving feedback and setting achievable goals for students based on Literacy and Numeracy target areas.
